






MULTICULTURAL ENVIRONMENT IMMIGRANTS 2.3% OF TOTAL POPULATION TODAY















INTERNATIONAL MIGRANTS IN CHILE Datos censales 1902-2012, CASEN 2013, DEM 2015 y 2017












Sospecha de HTA según grupos de edad. ENS 2009-10 y 2016-17




